

## First 48 hours

- Keep passport and aliyah documents accessible
- Save emergency numbers: 100, 101, 102, 1221
- Confirm temporary housing and local transport
- Tell family your Israeli phone number when active

## Documents and identity

- Keep originals, scans, and apostilles separate
- Track teudat oleh, teudat zehut, and appointment dates
- Write down every office, clerk name, and confirmation number
- Bring printed copies even when digital copies exist

## Banking and healthcare

- Compare bank fees, English support, and branch access
- Ask what documents the bank needs before arriving
- Choose a kupat cholim and note nearby clinics
- Ask about supplementary insurance only after understanding basics

## First 30 days timeline

- Week 1: phone, bank, healthcare, transport, urgent appointments
- Week 2: housing paperwork, arnona, utilities, local services
- Week 3: Hebrew routine, community contacts, school/work admin
- Week 4: review benefits, subscriptions, appointments, and next goals
